"Cutting the Mustard"



There is an old-fashioned phrase from the turn of the century (no, the one before this last one) where one could say of something excellent that "it really cuts the mustard." No one is quite sure where it comes from exactly, but it works for our Gospel today: the famous Gospel regarding faith and mustard seeds.

The apostles, perhaps beginning to realize exactly what the Lord was going to expect of them someday, asked, "Increase our faith?" to which Jesus replies, essentially, "Even if you had just a little faith—the size of a mustard seed—you could do amazing things." Look at what the apostles were able to go off and do with their faith: even St. Thomas, who famously doubted in the Lord's resurrection, perhaps went further than all the others in bringing the faith to India. The apostles were able to do what they thought only Jesus could do: heal the sick, drive out demons, and even raise the dead. They had tremendous faith, but even they started out with but a tiny seed.

When we reflect on the lives of the saints, those men and women whose faith has inspired Christians down through the centuries, we might find ourselves intimidated, comparing our mustard seeds to their much greater faith. But remember Jesus promises that a little faith can go along way if we would just do something with it! In other words even just a little faith can "cut the mustard," can be enough—more than enough even—to serve Christ exceedingly well. But too often we allow ourselves to cower, to be discouraged, and we do nothing. Consider, then, how that seed of faith came to be planted in you in the first place, how it was the faith of your parents, perhaps, that led to your being baptized and raised in the Church, and their parents, and so on back to your first ancestors who gave up their pagan religion to embrace Christ. How many martyrs, how many sacrifices and tremendous acts of faith plowed the field in which, one day, your own faith might be planted? If nothing else, consider that the seed of your faith, ultimately, came from the fruit of the Tree of Life that is the Cross of Jesus: your faith is a gift of Rev. Jacob J. Boddicker, SJ


