

Gratitude

Much has been written in the spiritual press about an attitude of gratitude. When we are the recipient of gratitude it makes us feel as through our benevolence was worth the effort. Doing something good for someone doesn't mean that we expect praise and accolades for our good deed, but it is nice to be recognized that we made an attempt to make someone happy or to better their lives.

Jesus performs a life altering event for ten lepers in today's gospel. He tells them to go show themselves to the priests so that they will be re-admitted into the society. All were cleansed as they went on their journey, but one of them stopped. He realized that he was made clean, and rather than continuing with the rest who desired to go about their lives having been made whole, he returned to give thanks.

We have seen this perhaps in the immaturity and naivety of youth. Who among us has not witness very young children at Christmas scream with delight when, after opening a present, they exclaim, "It's just what I always wanted!" jumping up and down with excitement at getting what they asked for as they quickly run off to a corner of the room or to their own room to revel in this new gift. As parents, we smile and laugh at such antics. We are pleased that our children are happy. But there is something missing. Rare is the circumstance in which a child says thank you. So it is with the nine lepers who go on their merry way without giving thanks and appreciation that their request was granted. One knelt down and glorified God in front of Jesus. Not only did he demonstrate gratitude, but he also did it with humility. It was this demonstration of faith that causes Jesus to say," your faith has saved you."

Each day God grants our requests. He grants what we need. Yet, we fall short in retuning our thankfulness to him. Sometimes we try to squeeze it in a quick prayer as a "by the way" Lord, thanks. That seems to lack a certain humility. Gratitude and humility are intrinsically linked. It is that linking that makes gratitude genuine. Anything less doesn't measure up. All ten lepers were made clean and healthy, only the humble was told his faith had saved him. God does give us what we ask; in humble gratitude God gives us what we need most.
