Ex 17:1

After many years in our two-story home, it's becoming more and more difficult to negotiate the stairs. Upstairs to the bedrooms, downstairs to do the laundry. So, I've decided it is time to move to a one floor plan. As I look around the house, I find so much "stuff" that needs to be cleared out or I will never be able to move. I tackle a bit every day, but the task seems overwhelming. Today's first reading made me realize that, like Moses, I need to get help.

Moses was a great prophet and God favored him. But even Moses had trouble pushing back his enemies without help from others. Two friends helped keep Moses' hands lifted up so that Joshua was able to overcome Amalek's army. If one as powerful as Moses needed help, we should not be embarrassed accepting help from others.

It has always made me happy to help others. Even when I was a young girl I would try to make things easier for my friends and family. What I never learned was how to be gracious when others did things for me. I did not want help. I could do it myself. I had a blind spot when it came to my capability and my need for help. Now that I am older, I am much more aware that I cannot do it myself, but accepting help is still difficult.

I am so grateful that our Loving God sends help anyway.

We all need help from time to time. We all grow weary. We all need someone to support our arms so we are not overwhelmed by challenges. Many times over the past few months, I have been reminded of how much help I really need. My part in this dynamic is to let others hold up my arms, and be grateful.

As Ignatian spirituality reminds us, gratitude is ultimately expressed in the context of God. It's prayer. When I thank my friends and family or express my gratitude for others in my life, I ought to keep in mind that it is God who makes these gifts possible. The reminder is there in the original text for the Examen in the Spiritual Exercises: "Give thanks to God our Lord for the benefits received." God gives the benefits. God gives us family and friends and goodness and grace. So when I give thanks to the people in my life for the gifts they share with me, I am also giving thanks to God who makes those things possible.

Gratitude for the gift and gratitude for the giver, always remembering that the original Giver is God.
