Adsum! I Am Present!

"This little light O Mine - I'm gonna let it shine!" Did you ever sing this song as a child? As an adult? Today, we are urged to sing, if not live, this song. The song's lyrics urge us to remember that "Jesus came for me . . . I'm gonna make Him shine, and I'm gonna make it shine, this little light of mine." I am present!

Today, and, in fact, throughout this past week in scripture, we have had several illuminating examples of light. February 2nd was the Presentation of the Child Jesus in the temple followed by February 3rd - the Memorial of St. Blaise. Today we get a gospel that urges us to personify light and salt - to make a difference - and to ask ourselves, "What will our 'lit presentation' look like as we present ourselves to God and to one another?"

At the Presentation of the Child Jesus, Mary and Joseph took the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after his birth to complete Mary's ritual purification after childbirth. This occasion is also known as "Candlemas" in Old English. In French it is called "La Fete de la Chandeleur." Sounds like the Feast of the Chandelier, doesn't it?! So our little Jesus is like a chandelier that lights up a room! Do you? Can you light up a room? ... the world?

The next day this past week we had the Memorial of St. Blaise - patron saint of throat ailments. Blaise was a bishop and a physician who suffered martyrdom during the persecution of Christians. While in prison he performed a cure of a boy choking on a fish bone. En route to prison he helped a woman save her prized pig by ordering a wolf who seized the pig to relax its grip. Out of gratitude, the woman visited Blaise in prison with two large candles to reduce the gloom in the cell. Today we have the candle ritual of the blessing of the throats (come get lit!).

And today, we have scripture that urges us to be light and salt for others. Indeed, the First Reading sheds light on how to do this: "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn." In the Second Reading, Paul admits that "I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling," but his bold message is "a demonstration of Spirit and power" - despite his fears!

So today the challenge is issued. Can we personify light and salt, make a difference, and notice how the presentation of Jesus lights up the world.

Speaking of presentations, once when I got a new haircut, the cook at the Jesuit residence said to me: "Me gusta su nueva presentation!" - meaning "I like your new look!" Ask yourself this: What will your "new presentation" be as you are inspired to light the world up and shake your salt shaker?!

BLESSING OF THROATS

On Friday, **February 3**, the Memorial of St. Blaise, and at masses during the weekend (Feb. 4 and 5) a blessing of throats will be conferred after all the Masses. The custom began in the 16th century, although Blaise lived in the fourth century. He was the bishop of Sebastea in Armenia who, according to legend, saved the life of a boy who was choking on a fish bone. He is now the patron saint of all who have diseases of the throat. Please join us and receive a blessing of your throat as a sign of God's care for his people.
