## Stop in the Name of Love

The Law was incredibly difficult to keep and fulfill. As with any strict regimen or system of rules we naturally try to find shortcuts or, when those rules are relaxed, to relax them as much as we can get away with. When a rule is suspended all together? Good luck reinstating it later.

We can imagine, then, that when Jesus comes onto the scene people are excited not only because of His miracles, but also His preaching. It was something new and simple; He approached religion with a fresh perspective and it is easy to see how some might be tempted to think that the days of the old Law were over. But today Jesus reigns such notions in, not only saying explicitly that He comes "...not to abolish but to fulfill," and even connects salvation to the keeping of the commandments to the full.

To surpass the Scribes and Pharisees in right-eousness is to see the Law less as a set of rules and more as a school for the heart, teaching the heart what it has forgotten due to sin. In the Fall humanity lost its original holiness and original justice; the Law seeks to teach us that, but it cannot make us so. One need not murder to have the heart of a murderer; one need not cheat on his spouse to have the heart of an adulterer, for as Jesus says, "For from the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery..." (Matthew 15:19) and "a good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil," (Luke 6:45).

Rather, as St. Paul writes, "Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law...love does not evil to the neighbor; hence love is the fulfillment of the law," (Romans 13:8, 10).

#### **REMINDERS - FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday, February 22, and Good Friday, April 7, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday.
