

The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday.

Most of us are very familiar with the Sermon on the Mount from the Gospel of Matthew. If guestioned, we would probably answer with; "oh, yes, Blessed are they ... "We might be able to get through most of the Beatitudes that Jesus taught in that sermon. We may also remember that the sermon contains what we call the "Our Father." Jesus' disciples asked him to teach them how to pray. But for the last few weeks we have been hearing more from that same sermon. There are no parables to figure out and apply, no analogies of which we can relate like "salt and light." We simply have direct teachings of Jesus challenging us to go beyond the mere letter of the law. Jesus's teaching demands that minimalism is not enough to enter the kingdom of heaven. We have to be perfect!

Being perfect is something that scares us. Many either find it unattainable, and therefore, don't try or claim perfection and wonder why others aren't as good. Both attitudes are in error. Our concept of being perfect comes from a strong work and discipline ethic. We try to be the perfect musician or the perfect athlete, the perfect partner in marriage. Each of these—and many more—carry some standard of perfection. And, when we reach that level the goal posts get moved. Any athlete, especially an Olympic athlete, will tell you that perfection is short lived. Someone will come along to better the time, the distance, or the score.

But perfection in our spiritual life is an attainable goal. lesus sets the standard, and it has been in place over 2000 years. The goal is to "be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." We shouldn't take this as Jesus telling us to be the same as God (a certain couple named Adam and Eve tried that and look where it landed us all). To be perfect, even from our own English dictionary, is to be without fault. In that understanding lies the true meaning of spiritual perfection. God, of course is without fault. In our relationship to God and to one another we too are to be without fault. lesus points out the faults that have crept into human behavior. He reminds us that these habits of ours are to be recognized, addressed, and corrected. As the season of Lent begins this week, let us take a good look at our actions and attitudes so that we can be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect.
