The Corruption of Sin

One of the ways that lesus shares in our humanity is that he was tempted. Immediately after his baptism, Jesus went out to the desert where he was confronted by evil. One can almost hear the voice of the accuser trying to question Jesus and his use of power, his purpose on Earth, and his relationship with God.

"Yes...turn the stones to bread. You deserve a break today! You are sooo hungry. What harm could one rock being turned to bread do anyone? Give in."

"Yes...cast yourself from here and show everyone how powerful you are; prove it to yourself! You can make up any rule you like! You can defy the laws of creation. In fact, there is only you to decide."

"Yessss, you could be "king of the world". You can do what you want instead of following the will of 'the Father.' Who even is the 'Father'? Where is he now? What good have his rules done anyone? You make your own rules."

Our cultural view of temptation is a strange thing. Often included in the world of advertising and commerce to generate "playful" imagery, temptation has become a term we associate with letting go, giving in, and allowing ourselves to have a "little fun". However, temptation is never about being enticed to perform an act of good.

Temptation is always an urge towards something harmful that will erode our relationships with God, corrupt our understanding of self, and fragment our sense of care for one another. When we start to see temptation for what it is, a misrepresentation of good, we start to hear the voice of God calling us to something more. In understanding how temptation works on us, we can begin to allow mercy and grace to work more clearly in our lives.

Jesus believed in sin and knew it to be a powerful and corrupting tendency. However, Jesus was also the embodiment of God's mercy, and he knew that for whatever sin brought into the world, it could not overcome God's power. For us to acknowledge evil is also for us to realize that there is an alternative God is offering to us, that we might learn to live and love in a different way.

This Lent, let us be mindful of the voices that might tempt us towards something unworthy of who we are called to be. While we might look to our own sin and the ways that temptation slowly corrupts our intentions, let us see more how we are called to be aware of God's mercy and hope for us. For every sin that we perceive, may we become more aware of God's power, grace and love, healing us.
