

Transform with Love

My husband and I started coming to Saint Xavier 25 years ago. We had raised our children and were looking for a parish to call home. We had been to Saint Xavier over the years because they had mass times that fit our schedule with children playing different sports. There was always a time to attend mass at Saint Xavier. My husband loved the fact that it was an old Gothic church, much like the one he attended as a child. We had been very involved in our previous parish, so I was happy anywhere I could simply go and pray. We began with the 12-noon mass. We were not there many weeks when the couple who sat directly behind us introduced themselves to us - Ann and Ray Fetick. We then met Earl and Virginia Kramer, who sat across the aisle from us. We shared the sign of peace with them. We were our own little parish community at the 12-noon mass. Eventually, the allure of the choir and incense drew us to the 10:30 mass, which I have attended ever since.

I am sure most of the members of St. Xavier parish have similar stories. Each chose a particular mass time, one of the "parish within a parish" congregations, as their preferred place to worship. Most of us pass seven other parishes on our way to St. Xavier. Why do we come to this place?

There is a special feeling of hospitality and acceptance here. You almost feel the embrace of this church when you walk through the doors. It's like a warm hug, welcoming you back. It is a place where the spirit of God resides.

We come to mass each week to reflect on God's Word and the Good News of the Salvation story. Today we hear of the Transfiguration of Jesus while He is with His friends. They witnessed Jesus as God's Son and the fulfillment of the law. His disciples were transformed as their faith was strengthened through this mountaintop experience.

Our faith, our sacred space, our priests, and our parish can inspire us to become the best version of who we are called to be. If we open our hearts and minds and come each week with the faith in Jesus that Peter, James, and John showed, then we can be transformed into the person our loving God created us to be. This church drew us together to become the people of God, called to transform the world with Christ's love. Let's be open to God's Holy Spirit this Lenten season. Together, let's transform our world.
