# Close Encounters of a Mystical Kind

The people you meet in public places! Today's gospel story describes a public yet very personal conversation that could be called a "close encounter of a mystical kind." It is mystical in its otherworldly connection to something extra- terrestrial, even divine. It is with Jesus. And the encounter presages the conversion of a people.

Have you had a close encounter with Jesus where your understanding of life, love, faith has been altered? Today we are privy to the longest private encounter that Jesus has with anyone in the New Testament- to "the woman at the well," and it is significant since it is with . "well... a woman!"

Not bashful at breaking provincial taboos, Jesus chats with a woman. This is strike one. That she is a Samaritan is strike two. And sharing a drinking bowl utensil to get water? Yikes! Strike three! Jews don't do this! You're out of this world! Jesus may have appeared to be an extra terrestrial alien in his interaction with the woman... and for his ability to see her for whom she is. May He do the same with you and me! E.T. phone home!

Meanwhile the woman's understanding of whom she is talking to is brought down to earth. "You are going to ask ME for a drink?" says she. And then she is sent into the stratosphere by Jesus' ability to intimately read her and launch her into orbit. She is shocked that Jesus knows she is living with a sixth man. "You are correct you are not married. You've been married five times and now living with a sixth!" says Jesus.

I believe that this story is about mission – hers, yours, OUR mission. Our collective mission project is to live and preach the gospel, - we men, women, and children. It is "mission possible" – that starts with a shocking mystical encounter that exposes our familiar foibles. Yet we are all eligible missionaries.

This mystical collision of Jesus with a stunned Samaritan woman can ignite the latent evangelical fervor in all of us. She and we are primed to action in our ability to convert society, a whole town, a whole people, via our testimony and reformed lives. "He told me everything about me!" she exclaims - the good, bad and ugly!

At the well of life, Jesus is "next level" here. He takes drink and food to new understandings. I AM the living water. I AM the bread of life he reminds us. May we echo our Samaritan woman at the well who entertains an intimate conversation with Christ that changes her life. She no longer is some goofy serial wife going on her sixth boyfriend. She is an evangelizer who excitedly carries off the word of God. May we be so inclined to say, like she did – "Sir, give me this living water!" after a close encounter of a mystical kind.

#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

The Cathedral/St Xavier Conference of St. Vincent de Paul is an allvolunteer organization serving the Downtown, OTR and Pendleton neighborhoods. The mission is to help solve short term emergency needs, such as rent, utility bills, furniture, beds, food, etc. for people living in those neighborhoods. On Saturday mornings, our volunteers pair up and visit the homes of neighbors in need. We then meet to decide what needs to be done to meet these needs. Often, this helps avoid an eviction or electric cut-off. We are guided by Jesus's words "What you do to the least of my brethren, you do to me". In the last quarter of 2022, we were able to help 82 families.

The conference relies entirely upon local donations to do this important work and we need your help.
