"You Gotta Have Faith"

How many times have you heard this phrase? It has been stated millions of times to keep hope alive. The phrase was made popular in a song by singer George Michael but in a different context. In the second reading today, Peter states, "Your faith ... may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ".

Well, I am going to speak of another faith today. As you may or may not know, next week will be the last time Mass will be held in the main church area (Nave). As of the weekend of April 30th, Mass will be held downstairs in the Parish Center. As seen at the information meetings and in Fr. Paul's video, having Mass in the Parish Center will create a unique opportunity to experience the Mass as a parish family in a different setting. All the while, we will be anticipating what lies ahead in our renovated spaces above. As the first reading states, "All who believed were together and had all things in common."

Over the past year, the Facilities Committee has met numerous times to plan these projects, a process that has included the input of all stakeholders. These include the Midwest Province, the priests, the staff, and the volunteers of St. Xavier Church. Ideas were brought forth, and an architect and a Church Interior Design Team were secured. A design for both areas (Sacristy and Nave) was prepared and approved. A plan was devised to create the least amount of disruption to the parish. The timeline of the renovation will be a maximum of six months. Contracts were signed with plenty of time for the different trades to prepare for a May 1st start date.

Now for the Gospel reading today: the "Doubting Thomas" in all of us. If you look up in the choir loft to the left, you will see scaffolding already. In that area is a mock-up of the new paint scheme for approval and tweaks to the design or color. During the next six months, we will be giving updates on the progress of the projects via email and the St. Xavier website. Our Communications Manager, Sam Aberle, and I will share photos and videos along the way. So have a little faith and pray that these projects are completed safely, on time, and on budget.
