Emmaus Among Us

"Where two or three are gathered, there am I," says Jesus. This statement becomes a reality in today's gospel of the Road to Emmaus where two people are commiserating with a man whom they shockingly discover is Jesus. Don't you love "Emmaus moments" -"ah-ha" instances of seeing Jesus right next to you? Up front and personal He is - when we open our eyes. Where is Emmaus for you? When I was once on a tour of Israel, the tour guide was not exactly sure where today's gospel geographically took place. He said "there are a lot of places called Emmaus." Indeed there are, even in the tristate area!

When praying with today's gospel I think of our Seven Sacraments and how the walk to Emmaus is a walk on a sacramental journey with Christ present. Indeed we



have our own "holy land" here since "Emmaus is among us" in our lives and in our Church. Sacramental people define us as Catholic, and we sure have "sacramental *peeps*" among us at St. Xavier!

The present Easter season sure is a fertile time for faith development as we celebrate the definition of sacrament: "a visible sign of an invisible reality." I like to think of sacraments as visible, sacred, "Emmaus" moments. We have had some wonderful "moments" this past Holy Week and Easter season. In fact, today, we have ten young people being Confirmed in this church.



Last weekend we had the Baptism of Isaac Joseph, and on April 16 we had 10 children make their First Communion. Of course the liturgical pièce de résistance was our Easter Vigil where we had seven adults enter into sacramental union with our Church. Two of the seven were baptized.

"With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him"....Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us? Is your heart burning? Can we live as people with open eyes and recognize the sacred power in the sacraments? We have Emmaus among us if we open our eyes and hearts. Jesus walks with us! Allelujah!


