Making it Work...

On Monday of this week, the parish center was filled with seemingly hundreds of chairs in what appeared to my eyes as an undifferentiated mass of sheer chaos. The overwhelming immediacy of what I was looking at filled with me with a momentary sense of despair. My thoughts turned from the chairs here, to the items in the sacristies above, to the conversations with various contractors and campaign managers. The only thoughts that rolled through my head were "Dear God...how are we going to make this work?"

With our move to the parish center, we are beginning a time of transition. As with any change we undertake, much difficulty comes from not being able to rely on our same habits. More difficulty is revealed as we attempt to learn how to do something in a different way. While the certainty we find in our environment can create a sense of safety, well-being, and peace. When we lose comfort (such as displacing our spiritual home) it is easy to give into thoughts of despair.

Truly, though, to choose change means we will have to learn to live with discomfort and trust God to guide us through. Change is a necessary part of life. For us to experience change as an opportunity for growth, however, we have to set an intention. As the saying goes, change is inevitable, but growth is optional. As we are going through our coming change, we have choices to make about how it is that we will grow. We must make a commitment...choose to "make it work."

Our staff here at the Parish has borne the weight of heavy work over the past weeks. Whether planning how to move into the new space, how to store goods, how to keep the parish moving in a friendly way, nothing we have seen over the past several months could have prepared us for the move this weekend. Our parish staff (as well as volunteers) have consistently offered themselves to learning and growing, adapting and changing to suit the needs of a project that has surpassed all of our expectations. My gratitude for them is immeasurable. It is obvious, on a daily basis, that they are trusting their way into an uncertain future, and that they are committed to making it work.

The choice I hope that each of us makes over these coming months is not just to "weather" the difficulties of our move down to the parish center. Rather, I hope that we choose to embrace the possibility of change to help us grow together as a parish. As we learn to serve and worship in a new space, like the uncertainty of the disciples after the resurrection of Christ, we are being called into unfamiliar territory and being asked to do something new. May we each say "yes" as we grow together into the parish God is calling us to be in through the Son.
