

Being Deacon

For selfish reasons I would like to reflect in this article on the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. On this Fifth Sunday of Easter, we hear again how the early Church is expanding. The story is about community, indeed, the family of Christ. As the apostles continued to spread the word and make converts to the faith, the community who accepted the Gospel had needs, many of them temporal. Then, as today, it is hard to comprehend the mysteries of Christ on an empty stomach. The apostles called forth seven men, filled with the Holy Spirt, laid hands upon them and "ordained" them to an official capacity of service to the community. These are the first deacons of the Church. It was then, and is now, a service ministry and participation in the sacrament of Holy Orders. Think of the 12 apostles as bishops who established various churches throughout the region. Deacons assisted them in attending to the needs of the community. Today, deacons still assist the bishop in various ways and are most visible whenever a bishop presides at liturgy.

Far from just taking care of distributing food to the hungry, deacons were put in charge of the Church's treasury as the story of St. Lawrence recounts. Stephen was the first martyr for the faith being stoned to death while witnessing to Jesus and praising God. St. Francis of Assisi was also a deacon who renounced wealth and worldly ways and focused his attention on prayer and the presence of God in all creation.

During the Easter season we hear a lot about the deacon Philip who preached the Gospel and cured many. So, what can we take away from all this? Deacons are important in the life of the Church and their ministry is vast and far reaching. But the spirit of the deacon ministry resides in all of us. Though not ordained, we all share in the ministry of service to God and his People. We would be in error to think that only those ordained are to serve the community, perform the corporal works of mercy, or to spread the message of Jesus' love and compassion. We all share in that ministry by virtue of our baptism. Jesus calls us all to ministry, to be diaconal. Just as by our baptism we share in the royal priesthood of Jesus, we also share in the diaconate of Jesus who reminds us, "I did not come to be served, but to serve." (Matthew 20:28)

On Saturday mornings, our volunteers pair up and visit the homes of neighbors in need. We then meet to decide what needs to be done to meet these needs. Often, this helps avoid an eviction or electric cut-off. We are guided by Jesus's words "What you do to the least of my brethren, you do to me". In the last quarter of 2022, we were able to help 82 families.

The conference relies entirely upon local donations to do this important work and we need your help.
