A new installation in the Parish Center by artist, Holly Schapker, focuses our attention on how when we gaze intently at an image, we allow ourselves to be changed. Are images a mirror of the viewer, a reflection of the artist, or an entryway into contemplating the divine? Featuring some previously seen images, as well as new paintings on the life of St. Francis of Assisi and St. Clare, the artist allows us to examine the nature of spiritual intimacy in religious art.

# Do You See What I See?

Sounds like a Christmas song doesn't it? Here we are nearing the end of Easter season and I am thinking of Christmas. For some reason I was struck by the idea of shepherds looking up to see a star foretelling the coming of Jesus, and now the Apostles are looking up to see Jesus returning to the Father. Are our eyes open to see what the Lord has to offer? Are we observing everything going on around us?

Just a few weeks ago, we heard the story of "Doubting Thomas" and his need to see for himself that Jesus truly did come. In the readings today, I was struck that all of the Apostles still needed extra instruction and still had doubt in what they were witnessing. But with Jesus' ascension into Heaven, they understood what Jesus commanded and that he will be with them through the "end of the age".

In the second reading, Paul asks that the Ephesians be given the gift of wisdom – to come to know the mystery of God. The Ephesians, like ourselves, were not literally witnesses of Jesus' life. Paul asks, "May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call."

Priest/author Henri Nouwen wrote a book, *The Return of the Prodigal Son*. In it, he details his experience observing Rembrandt's painting of the same name. In the painting, all the characters of the parable are present at the same time. Nouwen breaks down his observation of each character and their witness to the Father's forgiveness.



The painting is very descriptive of each character's feelings, but there's another twist. If you look closely, there are others in the background, witnessing the event as well. Could the others be us? Are our eyes wide open? Do we understand how God may be working in our lives?
