Corpus Christi

"This the truth each Christian learns,
Bread into his flesh he turns,
To his precious blood the wine:
...Blood is poured, and flesh is broken,
Yet in either wondrous token
Christ entire we know to be."

These lines are taken from the Sequence for today's feast. In some way it seems odd that we celebrate a major Solemnity under the title of "Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ." After all, even celebration of the Eucharist is a celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ. Perhaps that is precisely the reason we set aside this particular day. It is easy to take for granted what we celebrate at each Mass. The Divine Liturgy transforms and is transforming. It transforms us through time and space to be sharers in the act of love of Jesus for our redemption. His passion, death, and resurrection were for our benefit. Lent and Easter remind us of that, and we are grateful, so grateful that we term our celebration Eucharist, which we know means "thanksgiving." However, our human nature can get the best of us and even the most devout can participate in Mass with a certain mechanical disassociation. We can recite the prayers, perform the gestures, and sign the hymns and canticles, without ever calling to mind the true sacrifice that Christ made.

With the Easter season having been drawn to a close, these Solemnities of Ordinary Time fine tune our attention of the mysteries of our faith. Once known as Corpus Christi (Body of Christ), the Church changed the name to The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This name change further reflects the passion of Christ, the loving sacrifice he made, and our participation in it. Jesus gave over his body—willingly submitted to death in order to carry out the Father's plan of our salvation. But he also poured out his blood for us. Scriptures tell us that he wept tears of blood in the garden, that blood and water flowed from his side as he was pierced. On the eve of his passion, he broke bread with his disciples and passed the Blessing Cup commanding them to "Take and eat, take and drink." Whether we consume under both species at Mass is not the issue. What we need to always be mindful of is that Jesus' blood was not just spilled for us but was poured out for us and spiritually washes over us. The Blood of the Lamb is an image used throughout the New Testament.

Our readings this Sunday call us to reflect on how God provides for us and how we are nourished by his body and blood. These are things we should not take cavalierly. Realizing that our physical life and spiritual life are under the care of our God should condition us to live our lives with gratitude. The Body and Blood of Christ is our lifeline—our eternal lifeline. May we never take that for granted.
