Love For All

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned. (Matthew: 9:36)

Working at our parish, one of the greatest challenges I have faced is dealing with the occasional "street people." Some are truly homeless, some suffer from mental illness, and some are panhandlers and hustlers. The challenge for me is trying to see them as my neighbor and be present to them without judgment — to try to help but not be played for a fool. How am I supposed to see them as my neighbor when I feel so skeptical and cynical about some of their actions?

When I first came to work at St. Xavier parish as part of the staff, I had very much the same feeling as today's Gospel passage begins..."moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned." Then began my long journey of disillusionment. I found people to be dishonest, to ask for money for reasons other than presented to me, to struggle with mental illness I could not make better. Some people were going through a rough patch and needed a little help, which I gladly gave, but the people were often street hustlers.

So how does a follower of Jesus handle this conflict? In some ways, how we respond to street people is like any other type of giving: it's a personal choice, ultimately between God and you. Each of us has to strive for actions that give us peace — the feeling that we are serving God in the way He wants to be served. That seems a good general rule of thumb. But what about the "regulars?" Those few people who "hang around" our church on a regular basis? Many of us know them by their first name. We know the ones who are more aggressive than others and those who are harmless. We all try to offer them the respect each of us deserves as a child of God. We try very hard to love as Jesus asks us to.

Jesus encouraged His followers to seek radical grace. Turn the other cheek. Go the extra mile. Give to one who begs. He talked about loving our enemies. He did not prescribe the precise mechanics of caring for the homeless or beggars. He taught broad principles about loving people with the surprising love that comes from God. That is our challenge.

If we can do nothing else, we can pray for the street people. Every time we drive by a street beggar, ask God to provide for that person's needs. God is the only true source of healing and help for the deeper underlying issues. And always remember...*there, but by the grace* of God, go I.
