

"Be Not Afraid"

In today's readings we are told to be not afraid for your reward is with God. In some cases, you may be terrorized. In others you may just be harassed or be embarrassed. Over the centuries, individuals have put forth tremendous efforts to promote Christian ideals. What sort of "Call" did they receive from God? According to the Second Vatican Council (Lumen Gentium), "All Christians in whatever state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and the perfection of charity...All, however, according to their own gifts and duties must steadfastly advance along the way of a living faith, which arouses hope and works through love."

The key phrase to me in the previous statement is "steadfastly advance". Barriers have been put up in front of people along their journeys to promoting the Christian faith. Somehow, some way, people have kept the faith and continued to press on. Just by reading about the lives of the saints, St. Ignatius was inspired to do the same.

Recently an old movie was playing on PBS called 'Lillies of the Field'. In the movie, a Drifter stops at a mission run by some Benedictine nuns. The Drifter, Homer Smith, (Sidney Portier) is convinced to build the nuns a chapel for the people of the area to worship. Homer asks where they are going to get the material to build this chapel. He is told "God will provide". Homer is doubtful, but it happens. The other side of the story is the nuns themselves. They left Germany knowing very little English and came to the southwest United States to serve the underserved. They went to a foreign land with basically only faith, hope and love.

It brings to mind Mother Teresa-her going off to India to serve the poorest of the poor. What fortitude that must have taken. How about Father Damien of Molokai? He volunteered to serve a colony of people with Leprosy placed on the island of Molokai. He literally embraced the people as human beings eventually succumbing to the same fate.

Last but not least, look at our own St. Francis Xavier. He went off to lands seen only by very few westerners. There were language, logistical and cultural barriers that he had to overcome. He was not always welcomed by the native people. His efforts, though, led to the establishment or at least a foothold for Christianity in the Far East.
