Hostess with the Mostest

"Can I get you something to drink?" Think about how many times you may have asked this question as an act of kindness, a gesture of charity. We all have many opportunities to play the role of host or hostess. Can we host our Lord Jesus, on a daily basis and offer him to others like a drink of water? Today, our readings reflect a theme of **receiving** and **honoring** a guest along with a vehicle to accomplish this: **water**.

In our First Reading "a woman of influence" receives and honors Elisha, the prophet who succeeded Elijah. Known for his healing powers, Elisha purified the town's water system that was prone to "contamination." Clean water was the result. In the reading from Kings the grateful woman and her husband create a resting place for their frequent guest, Elisha, and he lifts their spirits in exclaiming that she will receive the son that she wanted a year from now. She will give birth to this son who will become sick and is cured by none other than Elisha.

In the Second Reading we are reminded of the power of the water of Baptism. It initiates and cleanses us, but we also die in the process - die to selfishness and self absorption. We are reborn into a spiritual life.

And in the Gospel it is demonstrated that whomever offers simply a cup of water to a stranger will be doing the works of God. No need to complicate things. "Can I offer you a cup of coffee? Cold water?" For when we do this, we play the part of an ambassador - a diplomatic agent, a representative who travels to foreign territory to **give** good will and also to **receive** visitors on home turf.

Today we have the opportunity to be an "Ambassador for Christ" – an official representative. This is to be a Host or Hostess. In fact, the Eucharist is often called a Host. We also hear of Hosts in heaven in the book of Revelation. "*Hostia*" in Latin means "sacrificial victim" and we as Catholics believe that when the priest prays over the bread and the wine, the bread and wine then become the body and blood of Christ - He, the ultimate Host. A host then is a "person who receives guests, stranger, sojourner, visitor. To be a host is be "bound by ties of hospitality."

Jesus tells us today, "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." We then can become aware that we can be "the host or hostess with the mostest." And like The Woman of Shunem, the hostess who received Elisha, we can receive the Eucharist as host, consume it, and then give away its curative, healing, and restorative powers. God uses His people's humble acts of service to bless both the giver and the receiver. May each of us then become the host and/or hostess of the mostest gift: Jesus.

HELP A FAMILY FROM UKRAINE




