

Those Who Have Ears

Perhaps it's just my strange sense of humor but I find it entertaining that this Gospel reading always shows up in summer. The analogy of seeds punctuated with Jesus saying, "Those who have ears ought to hear," reminds me of the vast corn fields that fortunately still envelope our community. The saying that corn should be "as high as an elephant's eye by the fourth of July," rings in my ears. Silly? Yes, but there is somewhat of a connection here. Using common language of the time for a mostly agrarian culture. Jesus describes a sower scattering seed. Critics have maintained that if the sower is God, then he should have been a more judicious farmer and cast the seeds where they would yield much fruit. But God is not restrictive in spreading his grace of love and mercy. And we should be eternally grateful for that. For whom among us can honestly say that we were ready and fertile to receive and cultivate God's word?

The seed of our salvation is offered to all of us. Indeed, Jesus himself offered up his own life so everyone can have eternal life. He did not choose a select few. He did not restrict this salvific gift to only those pre-conditioned. Rather, he spread this invitation to anyone who "has ears." In this case Jesus is telling us that "hearing is believing," not "seeing is believing."

For the past 60 years since the Second Vatican Council, we have had the message preached to us that we not only need to hear the word of God but to put it into action. That is the essence of evangelization. I fact, St. Ignatius gives us the charge to "Go, set the world on fire!" His mandate is to take the Word of God to every corner of the globe and be the sower depicted in Jesus' narrative. Our Lord knew that the time would come when he was not present in human form to share the good news of the Father's love and mercy. That would take the "hearers" to cultivate, grow, blossom—and as any gardener knows—drop more seeds.

We don't need to be a farmer to understand what Jesus is saying. We don't need to cover vast areas with our seeds of Truth. We only need to "have ears" and spread what we can wherever we can. Some of our seeds will not germinate. Others will be short lived. Still others will be choked out by the elements of this world. But some will find the right conditions and grow. Those who work the land understand this better than most.

In my favorite hymn, I found many years ago the meaning behind not only this reason but the purpose of the Christian life. You can find in in the blue Gather hymnal number 598, second verse of "O God Beyond All Praising."

The flow'r of earthly splendor in time must surely die, It's fragile bloom surrender to you, the Lord most high; But hidden from all nature the eternal seed is sown, Though small in mortal statue to heaven's garden grown.

For Christ, the man from heaven, from death has set us free,

And we, through him are given the final victory!

Whoever has ears ought to hear.
