

"Immediately Jesus stretched out His hand..."

Our Gospel story of Jesus inviting Peter to walk upon the water is well-known even to folks who have never read the Bible. It is astounding to think that Peter, a human being like the rest of us, managed to walk even a few steps on the stormy sea. But that is not even the most important element of the Gospel. Notice the consoling words of Jesus to His friends in the boat: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

In the ancient world the sea was a terrifying reality; ships rarely, if ever, ventured far from the sight of the shore, and foul weather could easily capsize a vessel. Certainly a little fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee was in grave danger should the waters become hostile! The sea was a symbol of chaos, a beast that could not be controlled or mastered, and yet Jesus walks not merely upon the water, but upon the sea while it is writhing and deadly, showing off its might.

Yet Jesus treads upon it as though it were solid ground: He shows that He is the master of all the might and chaos of the world. Why are we, therefore, so reluctant to trust?

When Peter accepts the invitation to venture out onto the water, he does not sink until "...he saw how strong the wind was..." and "...became frightened." In other words, when he let fear become his master, it conquered him. Prior to that, when his attention was on Jesus—when Jesus was his Master—he had mastery over the waters, just as Jesus did. Likewise Jesus invites us to trust Him in all things, even when it seems the world is writhing and in upheaval all around us.

What happens when Peter falters, when he is distracted and conquered by his fear? "Immediately Jesus stretched out His hand..."

Immediately.

Peter likely did not sink very far before the strong hand of Jesus was grasping his own. That is our Jesus as well: not only does He call us out into situations that seem impossible, not only does He exhort us to courage and trust, but even should we falter He is there in a moment to save us, to lift us up, and to draw us close to Himself as, together, we tread upon all that we fear.
