Peter, the "Everyman"

Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Matthew 16:16

Of all of the followers of Jesus, I have always had a special place in my heart for Peter. He was "everyman." Peter had all of the failings, doubts, enthusiasm, and love that we each hold in our hearts in our relationship with Jesus. Peter tried to walk across the water to reach Jesus; Peter asked for Jesus to wash him completely, not just his feet, to be made clean; Peter denied Jesus three times when it was the most crucial time to support Him.

But with all of his failings, Peter knew in his heart that Jesus was the real deal. He was the Messiah the Jewish people had been waiting for. Peter didn't get some secret message to realize this. He heard and saw the very same things all of the other people of his time saw and heard. But Peter had the gift of faith that is given to each of us. Peter heard and listened; Peter saw and believed.

It must have been difficult even for the disciples to declare that their new leader, Jesus, was in fact the Messiah they had heard about all their lives. But Peter was impulsive in both his behavior and speech. So, while his fellow disciples answered Jesus' question cautiously and diplomatically, Peter boldly acknowledged what he felt in his heart. He was clear; he was specific; and he described his fundamental conviction in a beautiful phrase. This Gospel story highlights Peter's central role as a representative of the disciples' community in this confession of faith. Here, for the first time, the titles of Messiah and Son of God are joined together. Peter wasn't constrained by what others thought or by their reaction to his belief. Peter declared Jesus to be the Messiah because God had given him that truth and had opened his mouth to confess it.

What did Peter mean when he used the term, *Messiah*? The fundamental meaning of this word is 'anointed' or supernaturally empowered. This anointing, this empowering, is described in the Old Testament. Kings and prophets are described as having anointing, supernatural empowering, It is used generally of people who have a remarkable, miraculous empowerment from God.

Peter was the first of the disciples to recognize this in Jesus. Imagine Jesus' amazement that finally someone understands what He has been about. No wonder He immediately names Peter the rock or foundation of His fledgling church. It is a good reminder for each of us. Listen and really see what is going on right in front of our eyes. Miracles happen every day due to the actions of the Messiah.
