Undoing God's Work

A woman and her young daughter were neighbors of a couple who were long-time member of their church. Each week the couple would invite the woman and her daughter to come to church with them. After months of asking, the woman finally decided she would give it a try. Not wanting to be obligated to her neighbors, she and her daughter showed up unannounced one Sunday. They took a seat a little less than halfway down the aisle. She watched as people walked in, some glancing at her with a little smile, some with wide eyes. She was glad they smiled at her, or maybe it was her young daughter. Anyway, they seem friendly. She listened attentively to the Mass: the singing, the prayers, the preaching. It all seemed so warm, so comforting. When it came to the Sign of Peace she watched as people turned toward one another and shook hands. Some couples even embraced in a kiss. "No wonder my neighbors wanted me to come," she thought. This place is awesome. She shook hands with those next to her and in front of her but didn't get enough time to turn around to greet the couple behind her. She glanced backward and gave an acknowledging nod, then fixed her attention on the people going up to receive Communion. "I want to be part of that," she thought.

After Mass she lingered as people filed out, casually saying "hello" or "have a nice day." As she got up to leave with her daughter, she saw the couple behind her kneeling in place. She turned and spoke to them, "Hi this is my first time here. I can't describe how wonderful it felt. I think I want to know more about this faith and this church. Tell me, is it always like this? I really want to come back!"

The couple stood up and the man began to speak, "Young lady, if you come back there is one thing you should know. You were sitting in my seat." With that they left in a huff. Her heart sunk.

All the good work God does can be undone in an instant by those who believe they have a right to something because they have been at it longer. So it is with the parable in today's Gospel. God calls some of us early in life, some he calls later. The determination is His, and His alone. Let us not be jealous of God's benevolence or his timing.
