Think Globally, Act Locally

A recent gospel, (Luke 8:1-3) featured the twelve Apostles assisted by three women who "provided for them out of their resources." What resources do we have to offer our Church? How can we employ these resources locally while keeping in mind global universal needs? Released on February 19, 2019, four Universal Apostolic Preferences for the Society of Jesus were announced by the Jesuit Superior General, Fr. Arturo Sosa, S.J. These priorities were identified through a fruitful process of discernment lasting almost two years. All Jesuits were invited to take part with many representational mission partners. The process concluded with a confirmation from Pope Francis in a special meeting with Fr. Sosa.

The Four Preferences are:

- 1. To show the way to God through *The Spiritual Exercises* and discernment
- 2. To walk with the poor, the outcasts of the world, and those whose dignity has been violated, in a mission of reconciliation and justice
- 3. To accompany young people in the creation of a hope-filled future
- 4. To collaborate in the care of our Common Home, the Earth

Each year, our Jesuit Parish Family concentrates on one of these Universal Apostolic Preferences. This year (2023-2024) we will showcase and promote the gift of *The Spiritual Exercises* — written by St. Ignatius of Loyola. As we continue through the year, we will promote familiarity with the Spiritual Exercises in a column in this Bulletin. Look for more forthcoming information. To start off our promotion of the *Exercises*, we launched a retreat series called "The Ignatian Prayer Adventure — the *Spiritual Exercises* in Everyday Life". By engaging in these exercises, we can hope to develop a more robust relationship with Jesus and be a part of the universal apostolic church which is also honoring this UAP this school year. Look for more opportunities to come!

See the Big Picture

You say, "The Lord's way is not fair!"

Ezekiel 18:25

I will admit it: this has not been a particularly easy time for me over the past year and a half. I lost my husband to cancer, I moved into a condo and cleaned out our home of 41 years, and then I began to have some annoying foot issues. I struggle with my lack of mobility since I still feel mentally like I am young and vibrant. There have been quite a few moments during this time when I have felt the words in today's first reading, "The Lord is not fair!"

If you were ever a parent, you have also heard this lament. "You are not fair." I cannot tell you how often I heard this very complaint from my children when they were growing up. I was not even-handed in my treatment of them, and they would call me out about it quite often. I would always know that I was as fair as I could be. Circumstances dictated many of my actions. I knew in my heart that I never treated each child the same, but each child received what they needed at the time.

How often have we felt that the Lord was unfair in His dealings with us? How often have we prayed fervently, hoping for a good outcome, only to have our hopes dashed and our requests not answered in the way we wanted? In our hearts we cry out, "This is not fair!" I prayed so hard; why is the Lord ignoring me? That being said, another scripture phrase comes to mind: His ways are not our ways.

There is a story I once heard about the tapestry we each create with our lives here on earth. The strings of our deeds and experiences are woven with many colored threads to create the tapestry of our lives. Unfortunately, as we create this tapestry, we only see the bottom – with all the muddled colors and loose threads. It will not be until we reach our heavenly home that we will see how all of the dark and brilliant threads blended together to create the masterpiece of our life.

Our lives must be filled with faith and hope. Faith that our good Lord always knows what is best for us. Hope that allows us to follow God's will for our life joyfully and with gratitude.

We should look to the end of today's first reading for the result of a life filled with faith and hope. As Ezekiel says, "...if he does what is right and just, ... he shall surely live, and he shall not die."

The Lord's ways are always fair as long as we have eyes to see the big picture.
