

## **Becoming the Fruit**

Once while walking out in the woods, I came upon a place where wild grapes grew. Being inexperienced with wild fruit, I felt like I had hit the jackpot. The grapes were small, green, plump and apparently ready for plucking. Without hesitation, I took a bunch and plopped them in my mouth. Immediately I was overwhelmed by the sourness of these small, seedy orbs. I felt betrayed! How could something that looked so good and promised to be so tasty on the tongue assault my senses in such a way?

Turns out, the grapes we are used to eating take years to cultivate. The sun, the soil, and the water, all affect the taste of a grape. Turns out that, as people, we also take years to cultivate. For us to mature and grow—for us to become a kind, merciful, faithful, and selfless people—takes generations. It takes the constant care of sacrificial love to help build up a people.

The first reading provides the image, the place where the landowner can grow the fruit that is needed to make wine. Wine, which "warms the heart", was also used to make water drinkable (the alcohol purifies the water). In this tradition, wine was an aid to life in body and spirit. In one way of seeing, rules of our faith, our religious practice, these are the vineyard. The people that God desires to produce through our practice of faith create joy, make life palatable, and give life.

In the gospel we hear how the landowner has done everything possible to cultivate the crop. Not only is care given to the environment, but also we hear how servant after servant is sent to help the crop grow. Even the heir to the vineyard is sent to help it along. The people, however, do not want what the landowner offers. They want to take over the vineyard for their own ends.

The people religion produces are the fruit:

As for religion: what is it if we try to bend and break rules it took generations to come to understand, while also judging others for our perception that they are the ones breaking the rules? What is it if the religious practice becomes thoughtless, judgmental, self-centered, and proud? As for the produce: what is it if in defending our practice of the faith, our spirits become violent, cruel, unmerciful, and petty?

What does our faith call us to? What kind of fruit does it bear?

For our meditation this week, let us ponder this: "Whatever is true...honorable...just...pure...Whatever is lovely...excellent... gracious...worthy of praise..." let us think about these things. May we come to understand that these are what our faith calls us too. With these as our guide, we will not fall pray to the bitterness of our current climate. If this is our guide, we will become that fruit which can bring health, healing, and cheer to our world.
