When in Rome...

Late October is a time for tricks and treats, and the Pharisees present to Jesus a trick question today: should one pay the taxes due to the Roman oppressor, Caesar? A YES or a NO answer will result in serious trouble. If Jesus answered, "Yes," he would be accused of being a Roman sympathizer and lose credibility with his own people. A "No" answer to paying taxes would offer the Pharisees a chance to report him for insurrection as a Jewish revolutionary and have him arrested.

What to do? What is due? How do YOU "due" in your own duties? And... do we give Caesar his due? Jesus responds with a "Who's image is on the coin?" and then instructs them to pay the man what belongs to him. Today, it could be George Washington, Abe Lincoln, Thomas Jefferson, et al., or FDR, JFK, or JC? Perhaps JC could stand for Julius Caesar AND Jesus Christ as we give to each what he needs and deserves...with Jesus as our mentor throughout our discernment.

Indeed, Jesus shrewdly outwits his accusers with an "and" as opposed to an "or." We surmise then that we can have civic AND spiritual responsibilities while thinking like a "we" and not just a "me." We "give to Caesar what is Caesar's" AND "give to God what is God's" as written by St. Matthew, a tax collector.

Matthew, of all people, should know about paying taxes and how challenging it is to collect taxes. Like Jesus today, Matthew must have been embroiled in tax disputes à la how to redeem taxes AND his budding faith. Yet Matthew redeems both with his focus on Jesus Christ. He feels he must give to God what is God's – his life. With his career choice, Matthew may have nobly thought that the dignity of the human person benefits when a community collectively finances social services like health care and garbage pick-up via taxes. Or tax collecting could have been just a job for him. Nevertheless, duty to country and God are at stake here. Matthew proves to be an entrée disciple for Jesus to enter the world of sinners and tax collectors and redeem them. Matthew with his gaze upon Jesus as Rome bore down upon them.

Perhaps fitting today is the adage, "When in Rome, we do as Romans do," said St. Ambrose, the bishop of Milan, in his emphasis on liturgical flexibility and adaptation to local mores outside of Milan. This saying urges versatility and sensitivity to tradition and custom. And so, as we roam our world, what and where is Rome for you? It could be Julius Caesar, or Roman soldiers, or the Coliseum. It also could be our Roman Catholic Church, The Vatican. The Pope. Sacred Scripture. The Sacraments. The Commandments. Social Justice. Ultimately, can we emulate St. Matthew, who, despite his questionable day job, gave his life for Jesus? He reminds us never to forget to give God what is God's - starting with our lives.
