All You Need is Love

"The Law" we often hear of in the Gospels contained 613 precepts, laws that pertained to matters great and small, common and uncommon. It was terribly burdensome and virtually impossible to keep, though many tried.

Since the Law was given by God, not even the smallest Law was to be overlooked, and so when the Pharisees test Jesus in our Gospel today by asking which commandment in the Law is the greatest, they are seeking to trap Him, for regardless of His answer, they could criticize Him for downplaying the importance of any laws which did not make the cut for first place. Yet Jesus knows all of this, so He not only steps around the trap but with great wisdom, He eases the burden of the Law by distilling it down to two commandments: Love God first and foremost, and love your neighbor next.

Why love? Love, in one definition, is to desire the good of the other purely for the sake of the other. But God has no needs; how can we love Him for His own sake? Remember the words of Jesus: "...whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). When we love our neighbor, we are loving God. How must we love them? Jesus says in our Gospel today, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But we often struggle with that because we are so bad at loving ourselves; it feels selfish, or we simply despise ourselves. So we turn once more to God for help and remember that He so loved this world—and us—that He gave His only Son (John 3:16), who said, "...love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another," (John 13:34). If I love my neighbor as Jesus has loved me, then I am responding to and reciprocating God's love: I am loving Him back.

If we love one another as Jesus has loved us, we will find ourselves keeping also the greatest commandment of loving God with all our heart, soul, and mind. How can this be? When we consider that Jesus is God and that He has commanded us to love others as He has loved us, then we must also look upon the Cross and consider how He has loved us:

With all His Heart. With all His soul. With all His mind.
