# Reborn

At the end of today's Gospel, Jesus states, "For you know neither the day nor the hour." I know people probably had their doubts about when we were going to re-open the main church for services, but as of last week, we did it. We promised the first weekend in November, and by the Grace of God, it happened. It truly was a 'soft' opening. A lot of things still needed to be finished, but we were able to open the space for all to see and celebrate the Mass.

Our soft opening provided insights and issues to be handled, i.e., sound system, lighting, flooring, door locks, and incense. We know our new smoke detectors work well (going off at 10:30 Mass due to incense), but our microphones and speakers did not. These are addressable issues that will be resolved. The big thing is we got to share the nave, refreshed and reborn.

Usually, one speaks of 'Reborn' at the beginning of a new year or springtime. But here we have been blessed to be witnesses of a rebirth of our church. The architectural features have been highlighted and brought back to life. The stations are now featured compared to being just part of the wall. The statues of Mary, Joseph, and the angels have returned to their original positions. Last but not least, the tabernacle, along with the sanctuary lamp, is back in the center. We still have more to go: kneelers will be installed at the side altars and the tabernacle. In January, the rest of the stained glass will come back. And in the spring, we will have Gabriel and Michael statues installed high above the side altars.

This project was only done with a great team of contractors and project managers. Our timeline was from May 1 to November 1. This was a relatively short period of time to accomplish our goal. Project schedules were adhered to, thanks to prior planning. On May 1, numerous contractors were here on site to start work. Sometimes, they trickle in, and the ball rolls slowly, not this time. Thanks to Tim Steigerwald, acting as the church's Project Manager, he kept a fire under them the whole time. All in all, we had very cooperative contractors. The scaffold took longer than expected to install, but it did not slow the progress of the other trades. In the sacristies, we kept discovering issues such as hidden doors, ductwork, and five layers of flooring over rotted floorboards.

Our grand re-opening will be December 3. We will be able to share a more finished look, i.e., pews brought back up, all floors finished, lighting complete, and, of course, the sound system balanced. We will offer tours and have a reception to celebrate our accomplishments thanks to your input and generosity.
