# Crown Him with Many Crowns

Today, at the closing of the Church year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This is a relatively new feast in the Church, instituted in 1925 during a time of tremendous social and political turmoil in the world. The Church sought to remind us all that as the monarchies and kingdoms of old faded away to new ideologies and politics, we must not forget that as Christians, we do have a King—Christ—and we owe Him our love and loyalty before and above everything else. He is such a gentle and generous King, laboring constantly for His subjects and inviting us to labor with Him.

In our Gospel today Jesus tells us the well-known parable of the sheep and the goats, how at the end of time, we will be judged by our King on how we served Him. Any of us would do something for Him if we saw Him as He is: glorious, regal, and splendid. But what if we encountered Him poor, unattractive, unable to reward us for our service? Even then—as He was upon the Cross, or in the manger—He is our King: He is King by right, not by crown. And so in our Gospel today, we see that those who served Him in His need—by serving Jesus in the needy—are rewarded for their service, and those who are punished are not those who were wicked toward Him or who betrayed Him, but rather those who did...nothing.

St. Ignatius of Loyola reminds us that we were created to praise, reverence, and serve God; in His Son, He came to us saying, "I am among you as one who serves," (Luke 22:27), and also, "I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do," (John 13:15). Therefore, we know precisely how to serve Him: to do for Him as He has done for us.
