# A Rose By Any Other Name

Rejoice! The first word uttered in the Entrance Antiphon to today's mass is "Rejoice," which sets the stage for Gaudete Sunday, Latin for "Rejoice" Sunday. So, on this day, we light the pink candle on the Advent Wreath. For today, amidst the solemn Advent season, we get a burst of the color pink, or, as it is officially called, "rose." Personally, I like to call this Third Sunday of Advent a "pink candle kinda day" since it's a day where a pinch of lit pink reminds us to hope in the Lord. Still, perhaps "rose" could be an alternate term for the color since we are called to "rise" in our spirits. Nevertheless, today, we are reminded to prepare, like the three Magi did, for our destination: Bethlehem - with hope in our hearts. And maybe we can merge pink with rose?!

Today, ask yourself and your priest: Are you brave enough to wear pink today? to put on the color pink in a bruised world? Pink daringly represents hope, joy, resilience, courage, intentionality, and brightness.

With the help of John the Baptist and Jesus today, we can all put on the pink, rejoice, show it off, and wear it well. In the gospel, we have reason to rejoice: Jesus is coming to us; Jesus will save us; Jesus' star is on the rise. And we have some living and breathing mentors to help us don the pink. William Shakespeare once pondered, "That which we call a rose, by any other name (pink?) would smell as sweet" – whether a Montague or a Capulet, a John or a Zechariah, a Mary or an Elizabeth – for they all help us rise to greater heights and greater expectations.

Today, we see how two individuals, John the Baptist and Jesus, inspire one another and play off each other's strengths – as they advance in their ministries and give each other hope. Think of a good friend of yours who inspired you to go further – to rise to be a better man or woman. This is what we have here between John and Jesus – a bright resolve to prepare for God's coming. And this is what we can all do on Gaudete Sunday. Rejoice! Rise! So whether we call it rose or pink, or any other name, it would smell as sweet today.
