Workin' on a Weekend Like Usual

Our readings this Sunday begin with one of the most difficult theological problems. Suffering is a human universal that comes and goes (and comes back again) throughout our lives. But the aim of the Christian life is not mere comfort — believing such would be to treat our faith as a means to an end. Anyone who thinks we only believe in God so that we can feel good has never opened the Bible. The Book of Job confronts suffering head-on.

Job is in utter despair, drowned in hopelessness. He laments his suffering at the hands of Satan through all of Chapter 7, and rightfully so. Job has lost everything – his wife, children, house, friends, and health. He has every reason to shake his fist at the sky and curse God for allowing such suffering to befall him. Even in sleep, there is no respite: "If in bed I say, 'When shall I arise?" then the night drags on; I am filled with restlessness until the dawn" (Job 7:4). We are all familiar with the torture of a night of tossing and turning over as a result of a physical or psychological ailment. Our desperation for rest only magnifies the pain.

But we also know how this story ends: Job maintains his faith in God, and life itself. Tired or not, the morning comes and we have a chance at better sleep the next night. The Book of Job is a call to all who suffer – and, therefore, to all of mankind. Despite the evidence presented to us by malevolence and suffering and by even Satan himself, losing our faith only guarantees further misery.

As the morning comes, so does Christ in our gospel reading from Mark. The Word made flesh serves as the resolution to Job's suffering. After the miraculous healing of Simon's bedridden mother-in-law on the sabbath, "The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons" (Mark 1:33-34). Blessed with the divine power of his Father, Jesus becomes a healer of suffering. By becoming flesh, he showed solidarity with the human race — a solidarity which culminated in his own suffering on the cross.
