Walking with the Excluded as the Body of Christ

In today's first reading from Leviticus, we hear about the plight of the lepers: "[He] shall keep his garments rent and his head bare...he shall cry out, 'Unclean, unclean!'...he shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp," (Leviticus 13:45-46). For those hearing this in ancient times, the boundaries of inclusion and exclusion were clearly established: purity lies here with us and sin over there with the lepers.

Into that world entered Jesus, a man who embraced the excluded of his day - sex workers, tax collectors, Samaritans, and yes, even lepers. In our Gospel reading, we see one of those excluded lepers calling out for healing and restoration. Jesus responds with the intimacy of a physical touch: "Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, 'I do will it. Be made clean,'" (Mark 1:41). With that touch, Jesus undoes the ancient paradigm and creates a new one, one where we are all included in the Body of Christ, sinners though we may be! With that touch, Jesus invites us to see through the myth of purity – that our exclusions are a form of participation in sin. Like the leper, we, too, need to have faith in the healing power of God.

Who are the excluded of our day? Where do we as a society need God's healing touch? The list is long – the unhoused, those suffering from substance abuse and mental illness, the homebound and forgotten, those facing discrimination in its many forms, migrants and refugees, and all victims of war. Pope Francis has called us to build a "culture of encounter" with these excluded people, a culture where relationships trump politics and God's healing love flows freely among us. In 2019, the global Society of Jesus set forth four Universal Apostolic Preferences designed to guide their work across the globe for the next decade; they named their second UAP "Walking with the Excluded."

As a Jesuit parish, our St. Xavier community is committed to precisely that, exemplified in our motto: *Inward Reflection, Outward Action*. Since September, dozens of you have walked with a family of Ukrainian war refugees living in our former rectory, Ignatius House, as they heal from the psychological wounds of war and find in us a community of safety and security. You have put your faith into action, witnessing Christ's call to wholeness and holiness through this ministry of accompaniment. Thank you for being a light unto the world! The paradigm of exclusion yields to the Body of Christ, a resurrected sense of community, and the kingdom of God! For those longing for such an encounter, consider joining us in two weeks for a prayer service upon the war's second anniversary. As we go forth from the Eucharistic table this week, let us reflect on how we might be called to walk with the excluded as the Body of Christ.

Lenten Reminders: Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, February 14 and Good Friday, March 29, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252).

Please join us in the Parish Center on **Sunday, February 25**, after the 10:30 AM mass, for a prayer service focused on peace and care for those impacted by the war.
