

A Surge of the Divine Spirit

We enter the second week of the solemn Lenten season with today's scripture that aims to boost our spirits. We need this! The job of missionary, disciple, ambassador, or just being an ethical and moral person in 2024 is not for the faint of heart. It often requires stamina, perseverance, humility, and a faith that navigates roadblocks, stone-throwing, dislikes, frowns, insults, temptations, etc. Otherwise, in the process of everyday life we can sure find ourselves in a metaphoric prison of futility quite easily.

Yet Jesus keeps telling us that he has "arrived" and the Kingdom of God is at hand. Moreover, at some point, he will have to depart in order to send the Holy Spirit to us – to free us from our "prisons." Jesus calls this helper an Advocate. This marvelous advocate can testify, guide, nudge, whisper, or yell at us. In turn, we are urged to notice and embrace the divine spirit that offers us vital motivation.

Is the divine spirit hiding? No! For today, Jesus "arrives" in a stunning way – and "transfigures our understanding" of him and the Kingdom and his divine nature. Today, in the gospel, Peter, John, James, and *(insert your name here)* get a boost of Jesus glorified in dazzling white in a spectacular mountaintop experience that we have come to believe occurs on Mt. Tabor.

Have you had a mountain top experience? Mountaintop experiences are invaluable! We need one every now and then! Today, we can turn to the image of the Transfigured Jesus for spiritual sustenance – for energy, for life. We climb a mountain with the apostles who are bedazzled by Jesus in his dual identity – human AND divine. And with the apostles, we collectively prepare to subsequently descend the mountain into the challenges and muck of everyday life - the losses, deaths, births, joys, sorrows, the holidays and holy days, the Advents and the Lents.

Do we need a lot of baggage to do this? No! Jesus informs Peter, James, John, and us(!) with this powerful message: I am all you need. You don't need to build three tents, e.g., one for the law (Moses) or the prophets (Isaiah). I AM all you need because, well I AM both the new law and the new prophet! Moreover, our God is willing to sacrifice his son for us — just like Abraham was willing to give up his son. This is love in the first degree in a divine pedigree.

So, let us all be dazzled today by the Transfiguration that promotes the transformation of fear into bold exuberance as we ascend and descend life's highs and lows. Hold to your vision on this biblical "visio day"! For Jesus gives us a doozy of a vision today in this fabulous, dazzling mountaintop experience.
