

Vineyard Veritas

"I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5)

In the Old Testament, Israel is called a vine. The Lord planted the people of Israel "as a choice vine, all pedigreed stock" (Jeremiah 2:2). As first-century Jews and students of the Torah, Jesus' Apostles would have been familiar with this metaphor. Sitting around the table of the Last Supper, Jesus draws a distinction when he tells them, "I am the true vine" (John 15:1). The Apostles, during a moment of such gravity, would have been hanging on their Teacher's every word. What are the implications of this new true vine?

The student-teacher relationship runs through all cultures and traditions. All spiritual gurus have followers. Our online streaming services today abound with documentaries about cults. As the script goes, the cult leader lures a group of unfortunate souls to a malodorous-looking compound and inflicts his or her egomaniacal beliefs upon them. Once everyone has had their fill of mystical voodoo and financial exploitation, Uncle Sam comes to clean things up. Roll the credits.

What makes the relationship between Jesus and the Apostles—between God and ourselves—more than just a student-teacher relationship? Jesus was not just another spiritual guru. As branches of the vine, we are inextricably linked to Christ, for the branches and the vine are of the same nature. Without Christ, we wither. As St. Augustine put it, "he who thinks that he bears fruit of himself, is not in the vine; he who is not in the vine, is not in Christ; he who is not in Christ, is not a Christian." He offers us the opportunity to bear fruit, and we must remain loyal to the vine to do so.

All of this fruit business sounds great—sign me up! What could stand in the way of me being a good vine and bearing some delicious fruit? There is no rivalry between the vine grower and the vine, but there can be between the branches. When we engage in destructive rivalrous behavior with one another, we lose sight of what Christ, the true vine, desires for us. Later in the chapter, Jesus tells the Apostles, "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:12-13). Following these instructions, we can avoid worldly mimetic trappings and yield eternal fruit. Seek consolation and inspiration in this week's reminder that we are the branches and Christ is the true vine.
