# All You Need Is Love

In this week's readings, it is about love and acceptance of all. Jesus gives the message plain and clear that love is the way. "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you," (John 15:10-12). Become a part of God's love.

The word "love" is used quite a lot in popular music. I was curious, so I asked Siri how many pop songs have the word love in the title. It came back with a study done in 2011 stating there were 1187 songs recorded as of that date. I can imagine it is well over 1200 by now.

The majority of those songs were probably about a relationship between individuals. A few may be about family, friends, and/or God. Love is one of the most powerful emotions humans can experience. For Christian believers, love is the truest test of genuine faith. Throughout the Bible, we discover how to experience love in its many forms and to share it with others as God intended.

There are four types of love we can experience on a daily basis. There is *Eros* which is romantic love. There is *Storge* which is familial love. There is *Philia* which is brotherly love that unites believers. And there is the most important *Agape*, God's love for humankind.

I know it wasn't in this week's readings, but I often think about Paul's statement to the Corinthians (13:13): "So faith, hope, love abide these three: but the greatest of these is love." My take on this statement is that faith and hope can be shared with others but seem "me" centered. Whereas love is truly the way to God's love. Love is to be shared with all.

Jesus' unconditional, forgiving, selfless, sacrificial love for us must be the criteria of our love for others. The goal and result of our abiding in love—in God—will be perfect Joy.
