Father’s Day

Some may see the celebration of Father’s Day as just another “Hallmark holiday.” Along with Mother’s Day, these two designated Sundays in spring give us pause to consider our parents. Far from simply another day to purchase cards and gifts, Mother’s Day and Father’s Day tune us into the fourth commandment: honor thy mother and father. While the wisdom of God instructs us to respect our parents every day, calendar days like Father’s Day remind us that parents are important—not only to us and our family but to the plan of humanity. In addition to the obvious biological generation of offspring, parents are the first to provide, nurture, instruct, care, form, and aid in the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual well-being of their children. This is not only necessary for the proper development of their immediate progeny but for succeeding generations as well.

Father’s Day should be a day of reflection. He has given us all we have and all we need. He nurtures us, comforts us, guides us, forms us and constantly bids us to converse with him. He gives us sayings that are literally words to live by.

This Father’s Day, let us remember our fathers, young and old, present or far away, living on earth or living in heaven, and honor them as God requires. Let us also remember that Jesus taught us to call God our father, and so we have the confidence to pray, “Our Father...”
