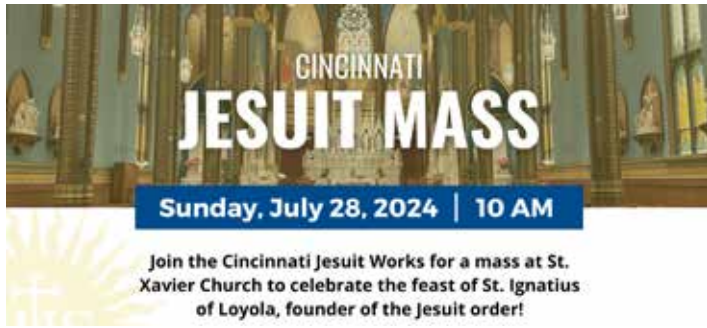

## A Lifetime Journey

It is "Wedding Season" at St. Xavier Church! Almost every weekend through the end of the year, we will welcome couples celebrating the Sacrament of Marriage in our beautifully renovated Church. In fact, we have already scheduled well over twenty weddings in 2025.

As Director of Marriage Ministries for the Jesuit Parish Family, it is wonderful to get a wedding request from a couple planning to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage at St. Xavier Church or Bellarmine Chapel! Their excitement is contagious as they settle on a date and begin sacramental preparations for their wedding celebration. It is a gift to share in the process that begins their journey as a married couple.

Couples can choose to be legally married anywhere and by anyone. That is why we should pause to recognize and celebrate the engaged couples who intentionally choose to be married within the Catholic Church. Those who celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage with a Priest or Deacon declare to each other before God, family, friends, and the world, that they are forever uniting as one through the Holy Spirit.

Couples who marry in the Church complete a six-month preparation period, fulfilling our Archdiocesan requirements. They meet several times with a Priest or Deacon who spends time getting to know the couple. They have meaningful discussions about liturgical teachings and the couple's faith journey, which helps them plan their unique wedding celebration. Couples prayerfully complete a compatibility survey and then meet with a married couple. Together, they discuss their relationship strengths and areas of growth. They also attend a Pre-Cana engaged retreat with other couples who have chosen to marry within the Catholic Church. The gifts, blessings, and results are abundant!

It will be no surprise to mention that those who marry in the Catholic Church have the highest marriage success rate! In other words, embracing the Holy Spirit, the sacramental teachings, and the preparation process WORKS! So please share and encourage those contemplating marriage to celebrate through the sacramental teachings of the Church.
