# Flock and Freedom

I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow. (Jeremiah 23:3)

The Lord is our shepherd, and we are His sheep. In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah looks back in time to remind His Israelite audience of the feeling of past exiles, of being sheep scattered far from home. But, new days are ahead in which the Lord "will raise up a righteous shoot to David; as king he shall reign and govern wisely" (Jeremiah 23:5).

In the Gospel, Jesus and His apostles go "to a deserted place and rest a while" (Mark 6:31) but are promptly followed by crowds of people. Jesus pities the crowd and begins teaching them. The Davidic king has arrived, but He is not a king of worldly power: He is a shepherd-king. As Theophylact, an 11th-century Byzantine archbishop, noted, "the Pharisees being ravening wolves did not feed the sheep, but devoured them; for which reason they gather themselves to Christ, the true Shepherd, who gave them spiritual food, that is, the word of God." The crowds were like lost sheep in need of a shepherd—in need of healing and direction.

Even our earthly shepherds are Christ's sheep: St. Apollinaris is a lesser-known saint from first-century Syria whose feast day is July 20. St. Peter declared Apollinaris a bishop and sent him to Ravenna, Italy, to develop a Christian community. Unimpressed by his teachings, pagans tortured and drove him from the city four times, but Apollinaris returned each time, eventually succumbing to wounds from his final savage beating. A sixth-century basilica honors him in Ravenna to this day. Despite constant opposition from his neighbors who scattered him away like a lost sheep, the undeterred Apollinaris returned to the remnants of his flock. With Christ as his shepherd, Apollinaris remained determined to win souls for the Kingdom of God.

Like St. Apollinaris, we are all lost sheep scattered varying distances from Christ, the Shepherd King. Human nature compels us to seek meaning and hope in our fallen world. Today's culture is one of "radical freedom," prioritizing individual autonomy and personal whims above all else. The world tells us to be our own shepherds. True freedom is found not in absolute autonomy but in a relationship with God, guided by divine law and the moral teachings of Christ. Where will we turn for direction? One doesn't need to look far to find influences—modern-day Pharisees—that can lead us astray. If Christ is not our shepherd, who or what is?
