# **Come to the Feast**

This Sunday we continue to hear from the Gospel of John about the living bread, and our first reading speaks similarly about a feast not merely of food and drink. While this Eucharistic theme has been present in our readings for several weeks, I am particularly struck by the image from Proverbs of Wisdom carefully preparing and extending an invitation to her table. Like Jesus' offer to partake in his flesh and blood, Wisdom invites us to a life-giving, transformational feast.

As I pray with these readings, I am reminded of the many invitations extended to me that have been life-giving and transformational. When I was starting out on my faith journey as a young adult, friends and family members invited me to join them in prayer. When I was curious about religious life, Sisters invited me to visit their homes to break bread with them. Then, as I discerned my ministry, those familiar with my passions and talents invited me to serve alongside them. In each of these invitations, I felt God's outstretched hand beckoning me.

Of course, not every invitation is one we should accept. As Paul warns the Ephesians in our second reading, some invitations will bring us life and fill us with the Spirit, but others will lead us on a path of ignorance. And sometimes, we simply don't have room for one more thing on our plate. Even in the case of multiple good options, we must discern which invitations to accept or deny and which paths to follow or avoid. I find that when I am faced with difficult decisions, it helps to invite others into my discernment, like my spiritual director or a member of my community who knows me well and can help me see through another lens where God may be calling me.

As the popular hymn says: We are companions on the journey, breaking bread and sharing life. Each time we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, we receive life-giving and transformational sustenance and accept Jesus' invitation to be in relationship with him and with one another. Although most of us don't feast on dressed meats and mixed wines on a regular basis, we are always invited to feast on the living bread.
