Xavier Jesuit Academy (XJA) is now open! On August 14, the new elementary school in Bond Hill began classes for



In today's first reading, we hear Joshua's oft-quoted declaration, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." It's a nice little phrase to hang above my mantelpiece, but what does serving the Lord actually involve? If I truly believe that Jesus, the Bread of Life, will sustain us through it all, how might my life look differently? Might I be called to follow in Christ's footsteps, to leave the comfort of my home, and encounter those living on the margins of society? Might I be called towards sites of discomforting grace where Christ meets us face-to-face?

Our new Jesuit Parish Family Vision Statement invites such a movement when it asks us "to bear hope and healing." To bear means to carry or support, and we certainly should do this, but it also means to endure something painful, as when Jesus bears his cross. The invitation, then, is not only to support hope and healing when it's easy but especially when it's not. Christ is calling us to see the wounds of the world with eyes of love, as God does, and to struggle to bear hope and healing in those places most in need of that love.

What that bearing looks like is different for each of us. For some, it is accompanying a family member at the end of life; for others, it is mending a relationship long neglected. For one, it is challenging polarization and loving our neighbors, especially when we disagree with them. For another, it is walking with the excluded and marginalized, serving the Lord-made flesh in the food pantry line or at a tutoring table filled with boys from Xavier Jesuit Academy, too long overlooked or dismissed. And for others still, it is caring for our common home as it groans in travail under the weight of what we've done to it these last many years.

This week, I invite you to reflect upon where those discomforting places most in need of hope and healing are in your life. Consider where God might be calling you and your household to serve the Lord. Then, take a first step towards bearing there.
