

Tradition!

Imagine you arrive at a dinner party and are greeted in a rather chilly fashion. You are interrogated with a barrage of questions: "Do you think it is a good idea to wash your hands before dinner?" Should you wipe your feet on the mat before entering a house? Should you bring a token gift for the host? You suddenly realize that you did not have time to wash your hands, you missed the welcome mat, and you forgot to bring a bottle of wine for the host! Meanwhile, the host is having a meltdown since someone folded the napkins wrong. Is the dinner party ruined? If we are at the Pharisees' house, it is ruined, for there has been an egregious lapse in etiquette! At this party, Jesus is on the hot seat as he is thrust into answering: "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders, but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?"

This week's gospel features the Pharisees worried more about minutiae than the welfare of their guests as they accuse Jesus of ignoring a long-standing tradition of ablutions before meals that includes ceremonial hand washing. The Pharisees are overly concerned with the incidentals instead of what is integral. Obedience to tradition trounces the spirit of the guests. And there is our Jesus in the middle.

I am reminded of the song "Tradition!", the opening number of the musical *Fiddler on the Roof.* Traditions are described in this catchy song that sets the tone for the climate of the times: "At three I started Hebrew school; at ten I learned a trade. I hear they picked a bride for me, I hope...she's pretty. The sons! The sons! Tradition!" And then the daughters sing, "And who does Mama teach to mend and tend and fix? Preparing me to marry whoever Papa picks? The daughters, the daughters... Tradition!" You can draw your own conclusion on the effects of these traditions, but there they are. The Pharisees are obsessed with the tradition of hand washing rituals and miss the point. God says, "I want your clean heart more than your clean hands."

What emerges from this gospel is the chutzpah of Jesus standing there—being interrogated about rules, rituals, and his lack of respect for them. And while he does have respect for these things, I see him slowly exposing his Sacred Heart. As the Pharisees shouted and criticized him and his followers, the silent beauty of the Sacred Heart of Jesus showed us what was really important. "I prefer your heart," God tells us. May we listen, learn, and follow Christ to what is integral rather than incidental. Today, Jesus leads us to not necessarily ignore tradition, but to add heart and soul to it.
