

# **Beautiful Simplicity**

Today we hear Jesus tell his disciples that he will have to suffer and die for the sake of the Gospel. As the disciples walk along, rather than accepting the sober reality of Jesus's revelation, they begin arguing about which one of them is the greatest. Oblivious to a reality they have yet to grow into, while they follow Jesus, they have not yet heard what he professes. Bringing a child into their midst and embracing the little one, Jesus says, "whoever receives a child such as this, receives me."

Little kids fully embody the strangeness of our human condition: with unguarded innocence, they share their mix of emotion, awareness, intelligence, and ignorance. Able to see through complexity, they can express perspectives with surprising perceptivity and simplicity. They are fully themselves, but somehow are not yet fully who they will become. They are willing to learn because there is so much that they do not know, but they have confidence that their perspective in the moment will suffice.

Is this not the way of the Christian? We are somehow certain in our faith in Christ yet mystified by the reality our faith describes. To be a Christian is to strive and never to fully grasp. We seek the love of Christ but also know that in our struggles, we will grow. We work towards being more virtuous people, but to do this, we must constantly come to the edge of our own ability. This place, the place of weakness and the limits of our ability, is the place where we most need the embrace of a loving God.

This week, like children, may we strive to live simply the love that has been revealed to us even when we are immersed in the world's complications. In faith, may we see ourselves as works in progress. In hope, may we trust that we will grow as children in relationship to our eternal God.
