God's Children

It is unsettling to us when we hear Jesus speak in ominous tones. We are used to softer, gentler Jesus who preaches love and forgiveness. Today's account must have been on one of Jesus' "off-days." It comes near the end of his teaching, when he tries to make his point by incorporating children into his message. Children, while having no real power or political influence, are valued in the culture. They are sweet and innocent and accepting of being molded. Jesus says that we should be like children. We should open ourselves to be receptive to his words and learn from what those words can do for us. It's a good message and one that is not so difficult to understand.

Then Jesus places a child in the midst of those listening to him and tells them to accept a child with love and charity. To do so means that you have accepted Jesus and not only Jesus but the One who sent him—God. Finally, Jesus again turns to a child and says, "whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great milestone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." Harsh words for sure but Jesus gets even more graphic: cutting off limbs, plucking out eyes, etc.

Grave sin is real. Intentionally rupturing our relationship with God is grave sin. The adjective used here, "grave," carries the connotation that intentional sin will ultimately send us to the grave, a death without recourse, a total separation from the God who is love. It's something to ponder, right? Jesus is using severe words to make the point that we need to return to innocence, to open our ears to hear God's word and our mouth to sing his praise. We are all God's children. Perhaps it's time we start acting like it.
