Faith In Action

When I practice forms of prayer like lectio divina or Ignatian contemplation—when I really immerse myself in a scripture passage—I'm often drawn to details that I previously overlooked. Specific words that once seemed insignificant take on new meaning, and I notice my heart and mind focusing on surprising parts of a passage. In this Sunday's Gospel reading from Mark, it's the specific action verbs used by the evangelist that piqued my further reflection.

When the man approaches Jesus, it is with enthusiasm and reverence. More than simply walking up, he runs up and kneels down before Jesus. He is earnest and humble in his attempt to please God, yet the response he receives diminishes his zeal and he leaves disheartened. The problem is, the man is primarily focused on following the law, but Jesus also calls us into relationship—with himself, with our Creator, and with our brothers and sisters in creation. Rather than merely abstaining from sin, we are called to put our faith into action. As our parish family vision statement reminds us, our faith should inspire us to be bearers of hope and healing, which requires us to move beyond personal piety into active discipleship.

It seems that the man in today's Gospel has some innate awareness of this call when he asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. When we speak of inheritance, we refer to something received through relationship rather than earned through effort or merit. Therefore, we obtain salvation in part through community, through kinship. Sometimes I hear people refer to the Kin-dom instead of the King-dom of God, which I think is a lovely reminder of this kinship with God and with one another.

The action verbs assigned to Jesus in the Gospel are likewise significant. We read that Jesus looked at the man and loved him. It was more than a simple exchange of words between strangers. Like each of us, this man was a loved sinner. Jesus saw him, understood him, and accepted him...and called him to something greater. Similarly, each of us is invited to let go of the things that prevent us from more closely following Jesus, from being in relationship. When we detach from worldly distractions, it is then that we are freed to put our faith into action and help build the Kindom of God.
