Humble Piety

Have you heard of the saying "Children should be seen and NOT heard"? Well, today, perhaps we can rehabilitate that saying to "God's children should be seen AND heard"! God wants to hear from us, as Jesus poses the question, "What do you want me to do for you?" Can we engage him in prayer and dialogue? This is our task today—to be heard. I have heard that the sign of a healthy parish is a crying baby in church since there is young life out there clamoring for comfort. Today, you and I can be that crying child. And we have one in the Gospel.

It's the "blind man" who is sitting at the roadside waiting for a miracle. Apparently, his sense of hearing is sharp despite his blindness, as he hears that Jesus is "on the Way." The blind man may have already heard our Old Testament reading from Jeremiah, which states, "Shout for Joy! Proclaim your Praise! I [God] will gather the blind and the lame. I will console them!" And then whadyaknow? Here comes Jesus down the lane. Despite being shushed by others, our blind man gets vocal: "Have pity on me, Jesus!" So Jesus stops and asks, "What do you want me to do for you?" Now, anybody with any sense would know what this man needs. But Jesus wants the man to ask him directly and engage his senses. In doing so, he acknowledges his situation and his reliance on God's help. Ask yourself—what do YOU want? What do you need? Is it pity or piety? More courage? Intelligence? Faith? Peace? Compassion? Patience? To go home? To hear better? To see better? Wisdom?

When I was a boy, I asked my Grandma what she wanted for Christmas, and she replied, "Peace of mind." Well, shoot, I thought, how will I buy that at Woolworth's—the store where I was going to buy her Christmas present with the \$5 budget I had? Then it hit me: I can't buy that. I can't afford it—wherever you get it. But I can go with my Grandma to church and pray. Today, we are all asked to dig deep and go for "the ask," as they say, in fun(d) raising. Here is a good "Ask" prayer someone once told me: "God, help ME to help YOU to help ME!" This means asking the Lord to assist me in my thoughts and actions and prayer life to make the space and time to approach you so that you can offer me assistance in return.

Indeed, to the blind man's credit, he is consumed with a big piece of "Humble Piety." But he also has persistence, faith, and the willingness to change. He defies the naysayers, throws aside his cloak, and "comes to Jesus." Can we have the zeal to do the same—for today, we all want to see better as we drop our cloaks (and daggers) and talk to God.
