The Greatest Commandment

A scribe asks Jesus which of all the commandments comes first; which is most important? Jesus replies not with one of the traditional Ten Commandments but with the *shema*, first encountered scripturally in the Book of Deuteronomy. In this, we see the first three of the Ten Commandments and any other aspects of the Law pertaining to God summarized perfectly. Likewise when Jesus says that the second commandment is to love your neighbor as yourself, in this is summarized all of the Law that pertains to one's self and neighbor. Jesus, therefore, shows the scribe that He has mastered the understanding of the Law. The scribe affirms this, and seems amazed at the sharp insight, to which Jesus responds, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

What does He mean by this?

It means that Jesus sees within this scribe an understanding and love of God's Law that is not common. The Pharisees would often fight among themselves about which aspects of the Law were more important than others while claiming that all aspects of the Law must be given equal weight since all of the Law is from God. But just as elsewhere Jesus criticizes them for being diligent in tithing herbs, yet they neglect the poor, Jesus today emphasizes that loving our neighbor and loving God are *inseparable*. How can this be?

In the Kingdom of God, God and Man are one; Jesus is the embodiment of the Kingdom. When He says that the scribe is close to the Kingdom, He is saying, "You are close to Me." To keep the commandments of God, to love Him and to live a holy life, means we strive to love both God and neighbor for in Heaven—as in the Kingdom to come—that is who we will be with for eternity. With Jesus in our midst, Heaven may begin whenever we, like this scribe, decide to take that first step: when we decide to love.
