Light Amid Darkness

Today's readings are unsettlingly apocalyptic. They describe the end of our physical world with breathless cosmic catastrophe. "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace. But the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever" (Daniel 12:2-3). The transition will be difficult, but we trust in God to deliver His new kingdom. While the readings contain a hopeful throughline, it's all a bit unnerving, to say the least.

I don't find much comfort in contemplating the end of the world. Most of my favorite biblical episodes are found in the New Testament: stories of Jesus' redemptive ministry, or St. Paul's passionate letters to early Christian communities. Perhaps I'm not alone. Hollywood, on the other hand, seems to enjoy it quite a lot. The apocalypse is usually depicted with some combination of plague, flooding, seismic catastrophe, nuclear holocaust, zombie infestation, alien invasion...what am I missing? Oh yes, sharks inside tornadoes.

But as Christians, we have a more complete understanding of the apocalypse. Our word, apocalypse, comes from the Greek *apocalypsus*, meaning "to pull back the veil." Notice how that's not the same thing as natural disasters and explosions. In pulling back the veil, a hidden truth is revealed. The end of the world will be a time of great distress, but peace will ensue under Christ's reign. "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (Mark 13:31). Gone will be the old world—symbolized by kingdoms, powers, and principalities—to make way for the new Kingdom of God to arrive.

We need only a glance at the newspaper to find characteristics of the old world: anger, hatred, exclusion, violence, and injustice. In a world often veiled in chaos, let's embrace the Lord's promise of a new world by living in faith, knowing that even in times of darkness, God's light shines through us. "The city has no need of the sun or of the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God has illuminated it, and its lamp is the Lamb" (Revelation 21:23).
