## **One Pink Candle**

One pink candle encircled by a wreath of green. Standing bright and unusual with its companions of deep violet. It almost begs us to ask, why the difference in color. As a young boy I remember the advent wreath on the dining table; the prayers before meals, my brother and I vying for the right to light the candles. Waiting anxiously until it was time to light the pink one. Sorry to say that the last violet candle was anticlimactic. The pink one meant Christmas was almost here. The pink one meant the preparations were nearly complete. Advent was more than half over. The pink one meant Christmas break from school was only days away. Pink meant a taste of a candy cane was a sweet indication of the event we were preparing to celebrate. Paper packages, tinsel, lights and garland, were not as bright as the flame on that one pink candle.

Advent has it's own very unique and important set of activities and themes. Each week the anticipation builds. The first Sunday we are reminded to: watch, wait, and be alert for we do not know when the Lord will come for us. The second Sunday we are reminded to prepare our hearts, repent, and take comfort in God's mercy.

Today, in the light of the flame from the pink candle, we rejoice, pray and give thanks. But let's be honest, this time of year can bring out some of the worst in humanity. We have heard the stories of people fighting in retail stores over gaining a sought-after item or bargain price. We know of people who will spend this Christmas alone due to loss of a spouse or perhaps in a nursing home. Almost all of us will feel the effects of the economy forcing us to cut back and find other ways to celebrate. Many people will be homeless and without anything to revel in for the holiday. Last year one of our inner-city churches fed almost 300 people a dinner on Christmas day. This year that number is expected to double. Many of us live paycheck to paycheck embarrassed that we are not far from needing assistance ourselves.

One pink candle gives us hope. It stands in contrast to the darkness that surrounds us and like John the Baptist it testifies to the light. The candle itself is not THE light but signifies Jesus, the Word of God, became human. God's love note, enfleshed in human form is coming. One pink candle tells us that our wait is almost over. There is much for us to be thankful for this Christmas. But perhaps the greatest gift that Advent brings is the gift of hope. It requires no expenditure on out part. It requires us to give up nothing. It can be given to friends, family and people far and wide. One pink candle reminds us that hope is a gift from God—and like all God's gifts, it is meant to be shared.
