The Hills Are Alive...

....with the sound of...Mary, as the mere sound of her voice sets the Salvation Story in motion. John, still in the womb, leaps for joy at the sound. They say it was John the Baptist's first homily. Prompted by Mary's voice, Mary's conviction, and Mary's gumption, today we hear what a difference her "greeting" can make in the world. Talk about the "ultra of all ultrasounds."

What does Mary's sound, echoing through the hills, mean to YOU? How does it change you? This divine energy causes a combustion—ushering in a movement in our hearts and in our world. May we be stimulated to do what she demonstrates for she is "climbing every mountain and fording every stream; she's following every rainbow 'til she finds her dream" to do a "Visitation."

And so it was back in 2007, in Mary's footsteps, that I ventured out to Israel. Destination: the Church of the Visitation. I was inspired (with the help of two Jesuit brothers) to take two buses and huff and puff it through the "hill country" of modern Jerusalem to its Ein Kerem section to find where Mary climbed those hills. It was a hot day, but we made it to the church. Conclusion: Mary was no slouch. While we were sweating via modern transport, Mary had no bus transfer, let alone a bus. I felt the presence of our girl, Mary, on her way to becoming Our Lady.


We next traversed to the nearby Hadassah Medical Center with its in-house synagogue featuring Russian painter Marc Chagall's fantastic twelve stained-glass windows representing Jacob's twelve sons. The light shined through those magnificent windows and illuminated the amazing technicolor tribal history of Jacob and sons. The light also revealed the conviction of Chagall, who fought against all odds to be a successful artist when Jews were outcasts. And the light revealed Mary's conviction. After all, she brought us all there. I felt the presence of Mary draw me closer to her vision, her integrity. Can we feel it? She is propelling us to be contemplatives in action—praying, moving, climbing, ascending, descending.

May you experience a visitation from Mary and be prompted to do your own visit to someone who could use a lift. Just like baby John got a lift via Mary—may we do a similar star turn as the sound of music beckons in Mary's deft navigation of the hills of life. She leads us like she did Dominic, Francis, Ignatius, Bernadette, and Juan Diego from a hill. Mary, the name she calls herself, please lead us far, a long, long way to run—as she brings us back to *know*...that Jesus is on the horizon.


