A Gold Star Worth Following

They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. (Matthew 2:10-11)

The magi didn't know where they were going. They followed a star to their west that would lead them to the newborn King of the Jews. I don't know about you, but I use the GPS on my phone a lot. If I had to get around town relying on the guidance of stars alone, I'd probably end up late for the New Year's party or, worse, at a Gold Star Chili. (Sorry, not sorry.) But there's something different about the star in today's Gospel, on this Feast of the Epiphany.

Whoever they were—sages, magicians, astrologers, etc.—the magi embody intellectual culture and the pursuit of truth through rational means. Yet, the Gospel tells us, the magi are following a star, traveling a great distance by faith alone. Like the magi, each of us moves through the world with an understanding of reason and faith. I have reason to believe that I can run a 10K race based on prior experience. I have faith that running a 10K race is an activity worth pursuing, despite the risk of injury or failure. Many conversion stories begin with intellectual arguments, like St. Thomas Aquinas' five proofs for the existence of God. But, the Spirit moves through the heart as well as the mind. Reason can play a significant role in our journey of faith, but it is not the sole determinant. As in the case of the magi, reason cannot always guide us on our way. But to better understand today's Gospel, we must move beyond the mere personal.

The Feast of the Epiphany marks the presentation of Christ to the world—not just to the holy family, and not just to the Jews. The magi were foreign to Bethlehem and foreign to the Judaic tradition—Gentiles from the mysterious east. The Light of Jesus is for the whole universe. The outgrowth of the Christian message to every corner of the world is evidence of the universal appeal of our faith. Today, the Epiphany can come to represent the internationalizing of the Catholic Church. All nations and people groups have unique cultural characteristics. One of the powers of the Gospel is its ability to respect many of those characteristics, transcend their differences, and unite all people within the Body of Christ. Like the magi, we are called to follow the light of faith, leading us beyond the limits of reason, culture, and our GPS.
