Blessing of Throats

O: Does it matter if the wine is red or white?

A: Some parishes choose to use red wine because it is a clearer symbolic representation of the blood of Christ. The symbolic element of the wine, however, is not to be confused with the real presence of Christ in the sacrament. While the wine retains its external properties, its essence is transformed. What is essential, then, is not the color of the wine, but the reality of Christ that becomes present through it.

The Feast of the Presentation

Today the Church celebrates the ancient Feast of the Presentation, also known as "Candlemas" due to the tradition of blessing candles on this day, and even lighting candles or having candlelit processions as a part of the Mass. The feast has been celebrated since at least the late 4th century and once marked the end of the forty-day Christmas season. Candles have been lit and blessed on this occasion in connection with the words of Simeon in our Gospel today, who refers to Jesus as "...a light for revelation to the Gentiles..."

Before the modern convenience of electricity, candles were the primary source of indoor lighting, especially during the night. A single candle in the center of a dark room can push back the gloom and yet the gloom is unable to resist. "What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:4-5). Therefore the blessing of candles serves as a reminder of the importance of having Jesus in the center of our lives, our families, our homes, to illuminate us with His own light so that we, too, may be "...the light of the world..." with Christ shining before us as we "...shine before others, that they may see [our] good deeds and glorify [our] heavenly Father" (Matthew 5:16).

The world has been a dark place for a long time, and the coming of Jesus brought light unlike anything ever seen before. Having been baptized into His Body, having been given the same light ourselves, imagine two Christs in the world, ten Christs, a thousand, a billion: and one of them is you.

Social Mission 101 – What is it?

At St. Xavier Church, our social mission efforts are guided by Catholic Social Teaching, the Jesuits' *Universal Apostolic Preferences* (UAPs) to walk with the excluded and to care for our common home, the Corporal Works of Mercy, and the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's *Love in Action* principle.
